# Christianity or Religion?

gospel-birthed, Christian life is a supernatural life. A Christian is a person who has become a new creation by the power of the Holy Spirit working through faith in the wonderful message of the Gospel. As a result, everything is new and different. The life of God has indwelled the soul and changes the Christian from the insideout. This produces a selfliberating and joyful experience.

Religion, on the other hand, is natural. It is the good and spiritual things that humans do in trying to please their god and others. It works from the outside and seeks to alter our behavior. It often mimics Christianity, but is the death of true Christian experience. It is a ponderous life that is filled with self-effort and discouragement.

It is absolutely essential that each of us grasps the difference between the Gospel life and counterfeit religious life. Here are some principles drawn from several thinkers on this subject.

In Religion, we strive to obey in order to be accepted by God, fearing what he might do if we're disobedient. But the Gospel empowers us to freely obey because we are already accepted, because the judgment against our sin fell upon Jesus, and there is no guilt or condemnation left for

In Religion, I obey in order to get things from God, often making promises about what I will do or how I will change. But the Gospel tells me what God has done for me, and his grace teaches me to obey out of joyful gratitude for all that he has already given me. I obey to enjoy God.

In Religion, my identity and self-worth are based on what I can accomplish, on how hard I work, or on how moral I am. Therefore, I look down on others who aren't as moral or obedient as me. But in the Gospel, my identity and self-worth are based on God's gracious love for me in Jesus, even while I was his enemy, unable to

accomplish or earn his love by my actions. Therefore, I can't look down on someone different than me because I am no better than they are – and probably worse.

Religion says, if I obey, God will love me. Gospel says, because God loves me, I can obey.

Religion has good people & bad people. Gospel has only repentant and unrepentant people.

Religion depends on what I do. Gospel depends on what Jesus has done.

Religion has the goal to get from God. Gospel has the goal to get God.

Religion is about me. Gospel is about Jesus.

Religion has an uncertainty of our standing before God. Gospel has certainty based upon Jesus' work.

Religion sees Jesus as the means. Gospel sees Jesus as the end.

Religion ends in either pride or despair. Gospel ends in humble joy.

So, what about you? Which life are you living?


The NEGA Housing Authority is in need of items for two emergency shelters.


This Bible study will help you:
